

BA graduate's are the most politically engaged and vital to a healthy democracy.




### Can History Grads Get a Job?





- More than 80% of Canadian managers feel that grads with cross-cultural understanding and knowledge of the global marketplace are assets to the competitiveness of their companies.


### **But Can They Make a Living?**

 In 2014 Association of American Colleges and Universities found liberal arts majors earn more than most professional majors at their peak earning ages.

 Average annual starting salary of Canadian humanities grad was \$32,200 in 2015. More than half had incomes of \$57,000 eight years from graduation; and the top 10% earned more than \$90,000.
